

UGANDA: GORILLA CONSERVATION ADVENTURE

Journey into the heart of the East African wilderness by exploring three of Uganda's famed national parks. Not only will we experience a series of captivating wildlife encounters, but we'll also make an invaluable contribution to the protection of these animals. Discover Corps offers this completely unique experience where you trek with a veterinarian and assist in the collection and lab analysis of gorilla data from stool samples, and learn more about the vital preservation work being done by the Gorilla Conservation Camp.

Over the course of 10 days, we will immerse ourselves in the natural world, with overnight stays in stunning safari lodges combined with excursions into a series of Ugandan wildlife reserves. Animal encounters will include tracking and observing chimpanzee families in their natural habitat, spotting elephants, leopards and buffalo on game drives, and coming face-to-face with rare tree-climbing lions - a rare breed of lion only found two places in the world - as you track them with a local conservationist.

In addition to safari experiences, we'll also enjoy a host of authentic cultural experiences, from visiting the children at a rural community school to learning basket-weaving from women involved in a local charity project.



TRIP HIGHLIGHTS



HELP PROTECT GORILLAS & COLLECT DATA WITH A VET

In Bwindi National Park, the Gorilla Conservation Camp is working hard to ensure a brighter future for Uganda's endangered mountain gorillas. On your visit to the park, you'll not only have the chance to see the amazing apes up close but will also help to secure their future. After gorilla trekking, you will be led to gorilla nests from the previous night to collect samples, and then convene at a research clinic to assist with analyzing the samples to monitor the health of the troop.



SUPPORT A LOCAL CHARITY PROJECT

Ride 4 a Woman is a charitable organization set up to support and empower women who struggle with poverty, HIV and domestic violence. You can lend your support while engaging in a series of authentic cultural experiences, from learning to weave baskets to pedal sewing yourself a souvenir, from a purse to a sunglasses case. There will also be a traditional dance performance, as well as an opportunity to join in.



TRACK TREE-CLIMBING LIONS WITH THE EXPERTS

Queen Elizabeth National Park is home to all sorts of amazing African animals, from hippos to leopards, elephants to hyenas. But for an incredible wildlife encounter you have to see to believe, nothing beats the tree-climbing lions. A member of each lion pride has been tagged so they can be monitored and tracked by rangers. You'll be led to a pride who are as likely to be lounging in the lower branches of a tree as they are to be roaming on the savanna.



CHIMP SPOTTING IN KIBALE

Kibale National Park is home to around 1,200 East African Chimpanzees, one of our closest relatives. After a briefing by park rangers, set off on a guided hike in search of one of four chimp communities that are habituated to humans. Once a chimp family (usually consisting of 15 to 30 members) is discovered, you will watch from up close as they swing through the trees, forage for food and communicate with other chimp communities across the canopy.



ITINERARY

DAY 1: Arriving in Entebbe

Arrive in Entebbe International Airport, about 45 minutes outside the capital Kampala, and transfer to our accommodation. Once a colonial estate and now a luxury B&B, the Boma Hotel boasts a swimming pool, restaurant and bar. After a delicious welcome dinner, you can spend your first evening relaxing before the adventure begins tomorrow.

DAY 2: Entering Kibale National Park

After breakfast, we'll travel to Kibale National Park and check into Ndali Lodge, the stunning hilltop boutique hotel we will call home for the next three nights. The rest of the afternoon is yours to enjoy as you wish – relax on your mountain-view veranda, take a walk around the lake or cool off in the swimming pool - before we gather for a homecooked, candlelit dinner

DAY 3: Tracking Chimps in Kibale

It's an early start as we head into the park for a day of chimp tracking. There are more than 1,200 chimpanzees in the park, and an expert guide will lead you to a chimp family, whom you can observe up close. See them forage on the ground for food, swing across the trees and call out across the canopy. Afterwards, it's back to the hotel for lunch and a free afternoon.

DAY 4: A Visit to Kibale Village

Today's all about getting to know the locals. In the morning, we will visit a local community school to see how Ndali Lodge is supporting local children's education, and in the afternoon, we'll explore the surrounding coffee plantations and meet the farmers who grow the crop.

Day 5: Driving to Queen Elizabeth National Park

We say goodbye to Ndali Lodge this morning and take a drive south alongside the stunning Rwenzori Mountains. We'll arrive at the Mazike Valley Lodge just in time for lunch, then head into Queen Elizabeth National Park for a game drive. It is Uganda's largest safari park, home to lions, leopards, elephants, buffalo and hyena, so there is sure to be plenty to see.

Day 6: Tracking and Spending Time with Rare Tree-Climbing Lions

You won't believe your eyes this morning as we track tree-climbing lions and cubs. See them lounging lazily on tree branches high above the ground. With sophisticated tracking devices, you're all-but-guaranteed to see a pride of these majestic animals in the wild. Later, we take an openair boat cruise on the Kazinga Channel to spot crocodiles, hippos and birds along the shoreline.











DAY 7: Driving to Bwindi National Park

After breakfast at Mazike Valley Lodge, we're back on the road. In the afternoon, we arrive at Mahogany Springs Lodge, a luxury hillside complex of thatched bungalows that sits just inside Bwindi National Park. After dinner, it's early to bed in preparation for the big day tomorrow.

Day 8: Bwindi Gorilla Tracking Day

It's the big one: gorilla day! We'll start early and set off on a (moderate) hiking trail to track down some of the gorillas living in these forests - home to nearly half of the world's mountain gorillas. Along with a guide, we will be joined by a vet, who will collect stool samples as we're getting up close and personal with the gorillas. That evening, we'll help analyze these in the lab to check on the troop's health. See next page for more details!

Day 9: A Community Visit in Bwindi

This morning, we visit a community-run charity project that supports women struggling with poverty, HIV and domestic violence. You'll learn to weave baskets and pedal sew your own souvenirs – anything from a purse to a bandana – as well as enjoy a traditional dance (don't worry, participation is optional!) We end today with a farewell dinner at Mahogany Springs.

Day 10: Flying to Entebbe and Home

After breakfast, hop on a flight back to Entebbe. For those with longer waits for their connecting flights home, we will head back to Boma Hotel to relax and enjoy a final dinner.

Queen Elizabeth National Park

In Queen Elizabeth National Park, we will stay at Mazike Valley Lodge, where you can see elephants and other wildlife roaming free from the private veranda of your spacious, traditional cottage.

Kibale National Park

In Kibale National Park, we stay at Ndali Lodge, a collection of luxury colonial-style thatched-roof villas set on top of an extinct volcano, with views of the Rwenzori Mountains and Lake Nyinambuga. A perfect place to relax by the pool, enjoy the spa, and marvel at the beauty of Uganda

And in Bwindi National Park, we stay at Mahogany Springs, a complex of beautiful individual villas overlooking the park – and occasionally visited by curious gorillas. This lodge also prides itself on giving back to the community by using funds from travelers to support a local environmental project as well as Sascu, an orphanage nearby.

Trekking with Gorillas in Uganda: Everything You Need To Know

You wake up and have breakfast with the sun rising over the equatorial jungle in the distance. The landcruisers arrive signaling the start of a once-in-a-lifetime experience - trekking next to gorillas in Bwindi Impenetrable Forest. Venture along the dirt roads to the starting point of the trek, a thatched roof visitor's center in the interior of the jungle. Meet your guide and get assigned a personal porter for the journey ahead. Then the drumroll...the guide unveils the gorilla family that you will be meeting today.

Nearly all of the world's remaining mountain gorillas live in the shared border forests of Uganda, Rwanda and the Congo. About half of these gorillas, around 400 live in and around Bwindi National Park. Each gorilla family that receive visitors have been habituated meaning that they can safely be around humans. There are a maximum of 8 people allowed to visit each gorilla family each day - thus this visit will be a special one.



The trek takes anywhere between an hour to 4 hours each way depending on how deep the gorillas are in the jungle. But the work is well worth it - as the gorilla trackers (who have been sent out prior to the group to look for the family) radio in that the family has been found, the excitement begins to build. Stand still as the gorillas come down from the trees and begin to walk right next to you. Some families have babies, others juveniles, but all families have an elusive silverback. The experience is truly visceral - watch from feet away as the gorillas forage, care for their young, and swing through the trees. You'll have one hour to observe these magnificent creatures before returning to their nest and collecting samples. These will be used later in the day to understand the family's health back at the lab - an exclusive experience for Discover Corps participants.

Gorilla trekking is an experience that only few lucky people get to have. However, there are some very important things to take into consideration:

- **Gorilla Permits** Discover Corps obtains your gorilla (and chimpanzee) permits as part of the trip fee. These permits are issued by the Ugandan Government and are strictly non-refundable. Therefore, you will be required to pay for these permits as part of a non-refundable deposit. The permits allow you to enter Bwindi Impenetrable Forest National Park and spend one hour with the gorilla family. The funds from the permits are used to preserve and protect the gorillas.
- **Planning** We *highly* recommend you book your trip 6 to 8 months in advance to ensure that we can obtain the gorilla permits. They are in extremely high demand and a set amount are released each day for tourists. High season runs from June-September and again from December-February. During these months, gorilla permits are difficult to get.
- **Age Restrictions** Although habituated to be around humans, gorillas are still wild animals and the Ugandan Wildlife Authority has placed a strict minimum age of 15 years old when visiting the gorillas. There are no exceptions.
- Physical Capabilities Gorilla trekking is, by its nature, a highly physical experience. The trek itself can last anywhere from an hour to four hours each way depending on how deep the gorillas are in the jungle. This equates to walking a mile to several miles each way in dense equatorial jungle. You will have a guide and porter with you who will help you throughout the experience. There is no maximum age, but we do recommend that you feel comfortable with walking long distances in the heat (and likely rain) along uneven trails. Please contact a Travel Specialist if you would like to discuss this in more depth.
- Safety Tracking gorillas in the middle of Africa may sound like a hairy experience, but don't worry, gorilla trekking is extremely safe. You will be accompanied by an expert tracking guide, a set of porters (optional) and an armed ranger (for protection against wild elephants). The gorillas themselves have been habituated meaning they will not be aggressive or harm humans. You just have to always be aware and abide by all rules that are stated prior to the trek including keeping a safe distance.

UGANDA-SPECIFIC: TERMS & CONDITIONS

It takes \$880 per person to register for the program. This consists of a \$30 registration fee and an \$850 deposit. The deposit covers a portion of the gorilla and chimp permits, which are immediately obtained and are, thus, non-refundable. Single room supplements are mandatory on this trip for all solo travelers. If a roommate is found of the same gender prior to departure, we will refund you the supplement in advance.

The due date of the remaining balance is based off the proximity of the trip departure date:

- If you register more than 5 months prior to the trip, the remaining balance will be due 30 days after registering for the program or 150 days prior to departure, whichever comes first.
- If you register less than 5 months prior to the trip, the remaining balance will be due one week after the deposit is placed.

Certain portions of the program fee are refundable, depending on the date of the refund request. If a participant chooses to withdraw for any reason prior to the departure, Discover Corps must be notified in writing. The refund will be calculated according to the date in which Discover Corps receives this notification.

Refund Policy

The amount of your refund is based on how far in advance from the start date of the trip you notify us of your cancellation.

- More than five months prior, everything is refundable with the exception of the Gorilla and Chimp Permits. It is therefore a\$850 fee per person to change trip destination or start date (for your new gorilla permit).
- Less than five months prior, 50% of program fee is refundable, except non-refundable \$30 registration fee and the Gorilla & Chimp Permits. It is therefore a \$850 fee per person to change trip destination or start date (for your new gorilla permit).
- At four months prior, the program fee is non-refundable. Changes to trip destination or start date are not possible and will be subject to refund policy.

If the balance has not been paid in full, the above percentages apply to all monies paid at the date of cancellation.

Transfers will be charged the applicable fee to change trips. Additionally, your refund policy tier will carry over to your new trip (eg – for transfers less than three months prior to the trip, your new trip program fee will remain 25% refundable regardless of the new date).
